

Defense Logistics Agency Awards Multi-Million Dollar Contract to Coker Logistics Solutions, Inc.

RESTON, VIRGINIA: February 14, 2007: Defense Supply Center, Richmond, recently announced that Coker Logistics Solutions, Inc. (CLS) of Reston, Virginia, has been awarded a five-year contract from Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), to provide DLA J-3/4 Enterprise Logistics Initiatives Support. The Department of Defense version of SAAP is known as Focused Logistics Warfighting (FLOW); the the Defence Logistics Organization's version of SAAP is known as LOGistics WARgame or LOGWAR.
